1. The FE Sector & What is 'HE in FE'?

FE College Sector

- Colleges in England (228 in 2022) provide:
 - traditional academic qualifications; technical and professional education & training (including apprenticeships)
 - for young people, adults and employers
 - circa. 1.8m students enrolled in colleges every year
- There are several different types of colleges in England: "General" Further Education
 - land-based specialist designate sixth form college art, design & performing arts
- Colleges are mainly funded by the Education & Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) other funders include
 Office for Students (OfS), Local/Combined Authorities, LEPs, & employers
- FE provision strong focus on supporting learners to <u>develop valuable workplace skills</u> through all
 FE provision is inspected by Ofsted
- Most colleges offer education at a higher level (L4+) as well as FE



What is HE in FE?

- Degree and degree-level qualificationsplus a range of L4/5 higher level provision e.g., HNC/Ds, Foundation Degrees, Higher Level Apprenticeships and Professional Higher-Level qualifications
- A significant proportion of Level 4/5 provision at colleges (approximately 28%) is full cost work, often directly funded by employers (in areas such as accountancy engineering & marketing)
- Colleges deliver about 10% of the total HE offer in England
- Mix of full-time, part-time and flexible online learning is available
- Seven colleges in England have Foundation degree awarding powers (FDAP) & three colleges have taught degree awarding powers (TDAP).

HE in FE: some facts & figures

undergraduate and postgraduate level courses ... of which 86% include foundation degrees in their HE offer

The proportion of large employers training their staff through colleges is **36%** compared with **33%** at universities

Colleges deliver 83% of all HNCs, 58% HNDs and 63% of all Foundation Degrees in England

Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF)

13% Gold, 42% Silver 28% Bronze

The majority of parttime HE learners and apprentices at colleges are over **25 years** of age. In contrast, more than **43%** of full time HE learners at colleges are under **21**.

Full time learners studying at an FE college are almost twice as likely to come from POLAR 1 & 2 (cold spots) as those studying at an HEI

How does 'HE in FE' operate?...

Two types:

- **Prescribed HE** masters degrees, first degrees and foundation degrees as well as postgraduate diplomas and certificates, and diplomas in higher education validated and awarded by HEIs
- Non-Prescribed HE professional awards by national awarding bodies such as Edexcel City and Guilds The Association of Accounting Technicians (AAT) The Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) and many more.

Regulated by the Office for Students (OfS) Funded primarily through student loans

Level 6 & 7 Apprenticeships subject to Ofsted review

'Franchise' with HEI

- Colleges may have single or multiple franchise agreements with different HEIs.
- Fees are determined (up to the maximum) by the HEI and agreement is reached on the amount of funding each institution will receive.
- HEI retains responsibility for the student numbers, the curriculum & quality.

'Validation' with HEI

- Similar to franchise but the student is directly enrolled by the college.
- Fees are set by the college (up to the maximum) and agreement is reached with the HEI on the cost for validation.

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Own Degree Awarding Powers

- In 2007, the Further Education and Training Act made it legally possible for further education colleges to award their own Foundation Degrees.
- More recently, this has been extended to include under-graduate Degree awarding Powers (DAPs) to colleges by application and approval by the OfS.

2. Similarities & differences between studying HE in colleges compared to university campus settings: A Student's Perspective

A student's perspective ...studying HE in FE

- Locally accessible (average 15 miles compared to 54 miles for universities)
- Familiarity with the college
- Smaller class sizes with higher teaching contact hours
- On an existing Level 3 pathway (often technical/vocational) with direct access (subject to attainment) to progress
- Strong employer links with meaningful and close relationships with industry and a focus on employability
- Often £ lower cost

- Many colleges have dedicated HE buildings and facilities
- Some colleges have been awarded the ability use the term 'university' in their literature – 'University Centre X College'
- Majority of students don't live in or move away from home - reducing costs
- HE college providers facilitate HE extra curricula activities ...and host Graduation events



3. 'HE in FE' provision in the North East

North East 'HE in FE' Headlines


- 13 North East College "Corporations" deliver some form of higher education provision (across 18 different NE campus locations)
 - I. One has full degree awarding powers
 - II. another two with foundation degree awarding powers
- NE Colleges have validation and partnership arrangements with a range of NE and out of area Universities – including Teesside, Sunderland, the OU and Arts University Bournemouth
- The provision ranges from HNCs to Post Graduate Degrees- with HNC/Ds, FDs and Undergraduate degrees being the most frequently offered
- Specialist provision in a wide range of industry sectors
