Supported Entry Schemes: Aims & Objectives





Sustained relationship and support over 1 or 2 years



Exposure to the university before enrolment to ease transition



Focus on knowledge and skills students need to make a successful transition into higher education



Provide equivalent UCAS points use at Northumbria to ease pressure on grades

Application Process

Online application form

- Personal details
- Current studies
- Teacher reference details

Teacher Reference

- Confirm student meets the eligibility criteria
- Agree student would benefit from the programme
- Point of contact throughout the programme



Eligibility Criteria

- Care experienced (priority)
- Estranged (priority)
- Young Adult Carer (priority)
- Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic (priority)
- Refugee (priority)
- Asylum Seeker or someone who has been granted limited leave to remain or discretionary leave to remain (priority)
- Live in a neighbourhood with a low progression rate to Higher Education.
- First generation to go to university
- Entitled to or in receipt of free school meals and/or discretionary payments and/or 16-19 bursary at any
 point during the last six years.
- Gypsy, Roma, Traveller, Showmen or Boater
- Disability, dyslexic or specific learning difficulty
- LGBTQ+
- Service child



Programme Content

On Campus Events

Opportunity to explore campus, meet support teams and current students

Webinars

Live and pre-recorded content to support transition to university and monitor engagement on the programme

E-Mentoring

Online mentoring with current Northumbria students matched by course interests

Podcasts

Informal conversations with current students, recent graduates and support services



Programme Completion

- Students notified of successful competition
- Supported entry points linked to Northumbria UCAS application
- Final Q&A with Graduate Ambassadors
- Students passed over to relevant student support teams if required
- Contact details provided to support results day and clearing queries

Alternative Routes to Newcastle

- Four alternative routes available:
- Sector leading supported entry route –
 PARTNERS
- Contextual Admissions
- Lead institution for the Realising Opportunities programme
- Sutton Trust Pathways to Law and Medicine





What is the PARTNERS Programme?

- A supported entry route to Newcastle University
- Nationally recognised Programme
- Has been running since 2000
- Over 8,000 students have entered the University via PARTNERS
- **1224** students took part in 2022





What is the PARTNERS Programme?

- Receive a lower offer of up to 3 grades from Newcastle University
- e.g AAA = BBB plus successful completion of the PARTNERS Academic Summer School
- Offer includes successful completion of a free Summer School
- Extra help & support while applying and once at the University

Realising Opportunities (RO)

- Lead institution for RO
- Year 12 programme. We work with a select group of target schools - 19
- Eligibility
 - State school only
 - GCSE requirements
 - Must meet 2 eligibility criteria or 1 if care experienced, young carer and/or estranged
 - More criteria met = more chance of a place
- 2 grades lower plus successful completion of ROP
- Students can apply to any institution in the programme and receive a lower offer from all





Sutton Trust

- Two year 12 programmes ran in conjunction with The Sutton Trust
- Eligibility
 - Local state school students
 - 5 criteria, must meet 1 or more
 - Particularly interested in high achieving GCSE students
 - More criteria met = more chance of a place
- Pathways to Law
 - 2 grades lower
- Pathways to Medicine
 - 3 grades lower





High Performance Athletes

- Looking for athletes competing at regional, national or international level.
- Must show a commitment to continue improving in chosen sport and representing the University.
- Must demonstrate previous and current sporting achievements when applying.
- 2 grades lower and/or
- Extra consideration at Confirmation





Contextual Offer

- Assessed using data on UCAS application
- Home postcode
 - POLAR 4 quintile 1 or 2
 - Automatic WP flag
- Care experienced students
 - Automatic flag
- Free school meals (new for 2023)
 - Automatic flag
- 2 grades lower
- Extra consideration at Confirmation
